Who May Attend?

To attend Wood Badge, individuals must:

- Be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America.
- Have completed the basic training courses for their Scouting position before the start of the course.¹
- If required for your position (see below) - have completed the outdoor skills training program appropriate to their Scouting positions.²



(1) Basic Leader Training for all:

- This Is Scouting (formerly New Leader Essentials)

and Leader Specific Training (one of):

- Den Leader Training
- Cubmaster Training
- Webelos Leader Training
- Tiger Cub Leader Training
- Pack Committee Training
- Troop Committee Training
- Scoutmaster Training
- Varsity Team Training
- Venturing Crew Training

(2) Outdoor Skills Training:

- Introduction to Outdoor Leadership skills (IOLS) is required for **Scoutmasters, Assistant Scoutmasters, Varsity Coaches** and **Assistants**.
- All participants are *encouraged (not required)* to complete the IOLS training (or BALOO for cub leaders) before attending.

What will be required of me as a participant?

- Wear your complete and proper BSA Field uniform for your position to the course.
- Full participation at all training sessions during two FULL three day weekends (no makeup sessions will be scheduled).
- A great scouting attitude!

A Few More Details:

All participants must present a completed BSA medical form before the course, or upon arrival.

Registration is available to all qualified individuals (see information at left). Confirmation letters will be sent summer 2010.

The course is likely to fill up very early—signing up now with a minimum \$50 deposit holds your spot.

You may submit your full fee now, or a \$50 deposit now & the balance no later than August 1st 2010 (otherwise your space may be lost and late fees will apply).

To qualify for the "**Early Bird**" discounted fee, all fees must be received in the Council Service Center by **May 1st, 2010**.
